Big, big news this month for you. You'd better pay attention to this!

After a year-long UUA-defined process of profile building, questionnaires, and discussions with several candidates, and with two formal interviews with Reverend Amy Brooks, the Board has accepted the Minister Search Committee recommendation that the congregation consider her for part-time contracted service. On the third and fourth Sundays of August, the Committee members will share background and impressions, and facilitate a full discussion of questions raised. There will be a special meeting and a vote on August 22nd, and we hope you will choose to affirm the work of the Minister Search Committee.

For our Sunday Service August 15 at 11 am, UUCoP will introduce Reverend Amy Brooks. Due to the difficulty of travel at this time, we cannot present her in person, so we will be offering her digitized sermon, "The Spirit of Life." For our Sunday Service August 22 at 11 am, UUCoP will convene a special congregational meeting for the purpose of addressing the recommendations from the Minister Search Committee and the UUCoP Board of Directors. The agenda for this meeting will be simple and will include two items: A presentation from the Minister Search Committee/Board detailing their recommendation for Rev. Amy Brooks, and a vote on acceptance of the recommendation. If you wish to see more, Rev. Brooks' sermons are posted on
