

Musings from the Minister

At the closing worship of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) General Assembly (GA) the choir sang a beautiful rendition of Bob Dylan's song, *The Times They Are a Changin*'. Indeed they are. As a faith tradition that does not root itself in a creed, Unitarian Universalists are deeply considering how we talk about our faith, who we are, and what we care about. What should change in our language as the times change? I am grateful to be part of a faith that is not rooted in a creed, unchanging and insistent.

For three years, the UUA has been planning possible changes to our current bylaws, known as Article II. This

section of our bylaws includes our Purpose, Principles, Inspirations (sources), a statement of Freedom of Belief, and a statement of Inclusion. Most of us are most familiar with our seven Principles. The Board formed an Article II Commission that collected information from thousands of UUs, held many on-line discussions, developed a draft version, collected more feedback, revised the draft and finally brought something to GA for consideration. The draft was amended during the assembly and passed, which means the congregations have a year to study it and suggest other changes. It will receive a final vote in 2024 requiring a 2/3 majority to be adopted.

The changes are substantive and creative. Much of the language of the seven principles was retained but incorporated into a set of six values: Interdependence, Equity, Transformation, Pluralism, Generosity and Justice. Love is the theological value at the center of the values. It isn't perfect. It is changing with the times.

Other work at General Assembly involves Actions of Immediate Witness (AIW). One of them is, "Protect the Dreamers, the Recipients of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival (DACA) with a pathway to Permanent Residence." Watch for worship services on this AIW and others as we work together to foster those changing times we want to see.


