Musings from the Minister

February 25, 2024

Our wonderful UUCOP community spent two Sunday services reflecting together on the meaning of our congregational life together. You shared clear ideas about what is important to you, and what you

might want to see more of.

You truly value the free thought that comes with our tradition. We do not have a creed, but instead focus on learning and growth. Our covenanted Principles support the values we hold without having to say, "I believe...." Such freedom encourages our spiritual exploration into different faiths, histories, and experiences.

With that freedom comes responsibility. Being part of a faith community has certain obligations. You said you provide some service to the community through financial donations and the local activities that some are involved in. Many of you said you want to do more, and perhaps even more importantly, you want to be known for the values you hold as you put your values into action in the public square. UU values hold meaning.

People who have been UU elsewhere knew they would be welcome at UUCOP once they found us. When we are gathered, we know we can be ourselves and be treated with love and care. Some of you are new to UUism and have found UUCOP accepting and welcoming. You want to build community. Since the pandemic, UUCOP has met on-line, with some exceptions. Many of you miss the potlucks, the coffee hour conversations, and the opportunities to be together that we enjoyed in the past. Having Sunday services in person and on line (hybrid) is desirable and will take a team of people to make it happen. Reach out if you want to help!

Being together might mean on Sunday morning and it might also mean gathering at events during the week. Sunday morning has its own purpose. Sunday mornings are peaceful and centering times. They provide opportunities to learn and be inspired by words and music. Attending worship is self-care, a time for a reset. That said, you are very aware that the congregation is absent children and youth — and you shared ideas on how to address that generation gap.

In these listening circles and subsequent conversations, you have posed many ideas of things you would like to do – too many to list! There is palpable energy and excitement! The Committee on Shared Ministry* will dig a little deeper into these sessions to learn more about the places you might like to go next. Please reach out with your ideas – and especially if you want to lead something! We are ready to listen some more!

The congregation is also in the planning process for a September retreat weekend with the other congregations in our triangle: Bay de Noc and Marquette. Watch for information!

We're celebrating! It's been almost two years (is it possible?) since we agreed to serve as co-presidents of the UUCOP Board for one year with a second year as a possibility. At first, we were obviously tentative as you can appreciate! Then when we found that the Board and other associated committee members were such great people and that working with them was rewarding and even fun(!), it wasn't difficult and indeed, we enjoyed it! So there was no question about the second year.

2024 is a big year for UUCOP because our bylaws direct that it's time to elect a new President, VP, and Secretary. It is, however, time for the Kinneys to move on to other roles.

SO, we ask that YOU, yes, YOU who are reading this message, be the ones who will say YES, when asked, will you serve? Or perhaps even volunteer to gift your skills and ideas to this organization, perhaps in a new way.

What's cookin" in the UUCOP kitchen? Some pretty exciting stuff!! First, we are hoping to hold in-person services this summer as many times as possible. On April 14 at 12:00 p.m. and April 21 at 12:00 the "Techies" in UUCOP are holding training sessions to encourage UUCOP members and friends to learn what it takes to connect the parts of the machines to actually make services available on-line and in person at the same time. Will YOU be there? We hope so. The availability of inperson services depends on the availability of technical support to make them happen!

A secret is that on April 21 we will be demonstrating the "Owl." It's a super-microphone/camera that can pick up voices from around the whole room, create a panorama of the group and zoomed-in image of the speaker, and make broadcasting easier and of higher quality. We

will be evaluating whether it would serve our purposes well or not so well and whether we should purchase this technology for our use. Be there to see how it works!

Second big thing: we are having a retreat! On the weekend of September 20-22, we will be gathering with the congregations of our Triangle partners, Bay de Noc UU and Marquette UU at Garden Grove Retreat Center at Garden, MI in the beautiful Upper Peninsula as the fall leaves begin to turn colors, the days become a little shorter and we celebrate the Autumnal Equinox! We urge all of you to think about joining the group.

Accommodations at the Retreat Center are reasonably priced and we will cooperate on the food for the weekend. If you need a little financial help to make attending possible, let us know and we will try to work something out.

Our minister, Rev. Alice will be there, along with Phil Lund from the MidAmerica Region, who is very knowledgeable and fun to be with. If you would like to put in some ideas about what we might do together, send us a message and/or contact Rev Alice! We will add those ideas to the planning group's deliberations

A few other things are happening with the Board that may interest you: The finance Committee has a new member: Barbara Sugden, who loves accountability and planning and keeping us talking to one another! Gary Sydow has retired from the Program Committee to devote more time to the Finance Committee, leaving a place which YOU could fill if you choose. Let us know!

Spiritual Deepening through Worship and Small Groups

Hello, peeps and geeks who care about the content and relevance of our Sunday services:

There's still time to register for the spring session of Spiritual Deepening through Worship and Small Groups.

This four-session course will lead participants through a process of planning a liturgical year that is authentic to their congregation, gathering resources on the year's seasonal themes, integrating those themes through communal spiritual practice in worship, creating opportunities for spiritual practice in small groups, and inviting participants to engage in individual practices centered on the theme.

The structure of the course will include both on-demand videos and in-person virtual sessions beginning with a 90-minute session at 11:30am Eastern on Saturday, May 4, and continuing each of the following Saturdays until May 25, 2024. While the course is open to individuals, congregations are encouraged to have two to four people

participate. The registration fee is \$350 for 4 people, \$300 for 3 people, \$225 for 2 people, and \$125 for one person.

The course is compatible with a variety of UU Holidays, Holy Days and Worship Themes, including Earth-centered Wheel of the Year celebrations and monthly theme-based subscription services like Soul Matters or Touchstones.

If we have enough interest to actually DO this series, (I am guilty of signing up for a bunch of stuff and then finding I don't have the energy to follow through) please indicate your interest to me by Wednesday April 10.


